NH Dyslexia Screening Law RSA 200:58 and RSA 200:59:

- Screen Students from K-3rd
- Two times per year
- Initial screening must take place within 60 days of the start of school- or 60 days from entry to school
- If flagged to be at risk (reading skills below benchmark)- a second benchmark must be used to help determine actions and next steps with evidence based instruction or referral.
 - Why a second assessment?
 - To confirm or dispute findings, or drill down to specific skills to help make informed intervention plan
- Cut scores determined by publishers of the screeners
- Evidence based screeners- help determine risk factors
- Intervention must start by January 1st

Screeners help determine risk but do NOT diagnose dyslexia. Evidence based screeners include skills: RAN/RAS, PA, Spelling, Phonics, etc.

Schools must notify parent/guardian

- Parents need the screening information in their hands
- Some schools send home the score reports

Schools must provide a written support plan that outlines the strategies that will be used to help student work toward their learning goals

Secondary Screeners-

- LETRS phonics screener
- LETRS Spelling
- Star could be primary, then Acadience as secondary
- Heggerty
- PAST
- CORE Phonics screener
- Quick Phonics Screener (QPS)
- WADE
- WIST

- CTOPP-2 * but collaborate with Special Ed Department
- **Focus on Students L1. Assess in primary language
- **Can be anything that will help you get more info based on the profile of the child

Note: For implementation, the Sending district is responsible for screening but charter school is responsible for implementation.

Some districts are using Acadience through the 8th grade now.

How is MLSS different from RtI?

- No longer wait to fail model of learning.
- Students can move through tiers and layers to meet their needs.
- Layer 3 is not special education. It's intensive support for any student who needs them.
- No specific time (minimum)

- I started at a new middle school this year, and they keep referring to Tier 3 as the students with IEPs. I keep repeating that it is not accurate. I think it's starting to stick!
- Question from Marianne McCarthy- Do the Intervention and Referral Services Team get involved in referral to the Child Study Team?
 - Child Find/Referral- you can call a meeting to discuss
 - You must still provide tier 2 supports while referral is taking place

- Will LETRS Training be expanded beyond the last cohort that starts in the fall many teachers want to sign up but are on waiting lists.
- Chris Evan's question- Would you also clarify Tier 2 as Strategic and Tier 3 as Intensive?
 - Tier 2- classroom teachers can provide targeted differentiation to a small group in the classroom setting where their plans show the specific targeted instruction of skills for that group
- I started at a new middle school this year, and they keep referring to Tier 3 as the students with IEPs. I keep repeating that it is not accurate. I think it's starting to stick!
 - Tier 3 is NOT just students on IEP's
- MTSS-R cannot be used to prevent/deny a student from an evaluation

- Does it make sense that a student identified with SLD in Basic Reading, should have both a decoding goal and a comprehension goal in the same IEP? I feel like since one comes before the other, I feel that we should focus on phonics/decoding first and later address the comprehension as a goal.
- I've scheduled these data meetings already for next year, a first at my new school.
- Can you please provide examples of interventions if a student has a 504 or an IEP and what kind of strategies should be in the plan for the teachers to help a student

 - Relationship between high quality Sor in gen ed or tier 1.
- PBIS Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports
